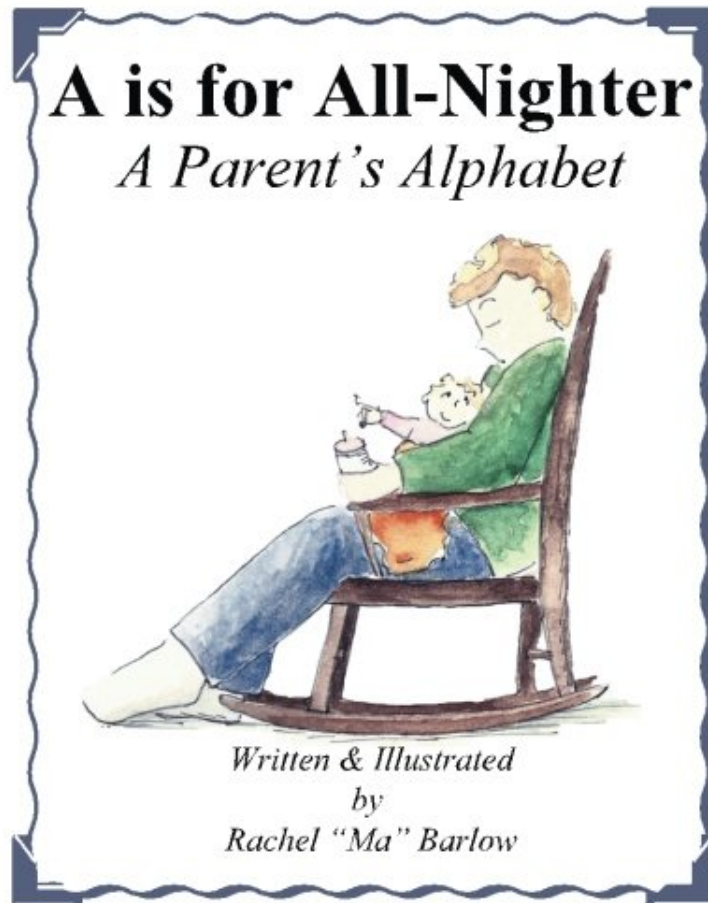

The book speaks especially to mothers and fathers, but grandmothers and grandfathers can laugh as well as each “letter” recalls some humorous – sometimes serious --- but surely inevitable, episode they had years before with their own “Thing1’s” and “Thing2’s.”
