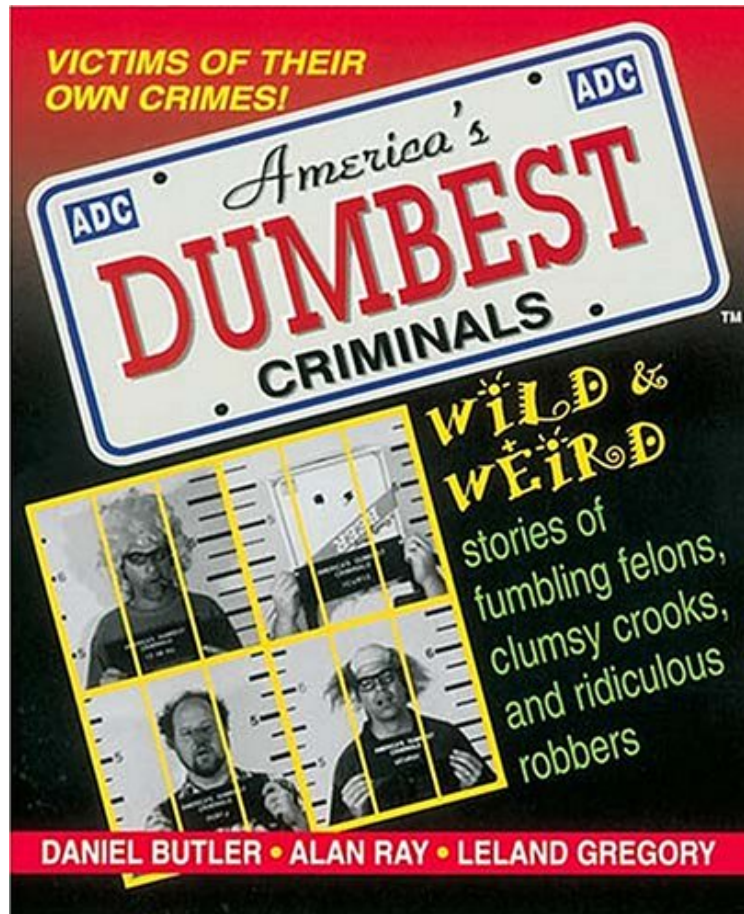

The situations are presented in ways that are funny. The backstory of some of the criminals history really help the events to take on added meaning that result in major laughs. Hagan After reading a book by the same author on Stupid American History (which I really liked) I expected another witty collection of random stories that hit much more than it missed. I was disappointed. Most of these gain what attempted humor there is by virtue of a police wisecrack about the incident rather than the incidents themselves. As a lawyer I've heard many dumb criminal stories from my criminal law colleagues that were almost all funnier than anything in this book. At least one story I found not only unfunny but downright offensive. As an animal lover (who lives with three dogs), I find nothing funny about a story of animal cruelty (spoiler alert!) in which a coyote is dynamited, no matter what else happened. I disagree with other reviewers who thought the book disorganized, perhaps because I read a prior work of this author that had the same structure (or lack of it). This is supposed to be a random collection of tales with no organization or theme beyond that suggested in the title. This structure is necessarily going to be a bit uneven, but when the great majority of the stories are amusing (as in his other book) it works fine. Finally, a note about the Kindle edition. To my eye the renderings of the occasional cartoon included are just fine. However, they are sometimes awkwardly placed. Some appear before the story, giving away the punch line. Some others are so far behind the depicted story element that they add nothing in my opinion. As I've noted from other Kindle editions including illustrations, it seems the Kindle can't show text and a picture at the same time (beyond a caption, anyway).
