By Grandma Zizzy2017 Update: This book is an absolute MUST for all Buckeye babies - at least according to my husband! Gosh, this was perfect as one of the gifts for our middle grandson several Christmases ago (he was 21 months old at the time), even though the words included weren't ACTUALLY his first Ohio State words. My husband bleeds scarlet and gray, and PRIOR to both his and our older grandson's first birthdays, he had trained them - at the conclusion of our singing the Ohio State fight song - to say "Go Bucks!" But this is a darling board book, and I must say that our grandson was QUITE proud of himself (as was grandpa!) when he learned ALL of the words in this book by New Year's Eve, much to the amazement and amusement of our extended family! I myself was particularly proud when he learned the first item, which included his first 5 syllable word... "University Hall"! The second item is "Scarlet and Gray", then (my favorite) is "Mirror Lake" (his version sounds more like "Meeyew Yake"), then comes "Brutus Buckeye", "Script Ohio", "Carmen Ohio", "Horseshoe", and finally "Ohio State University". The book measures 6 1/2" x 5 3/4" and is 5/8" thick, which was perfect for both his little hands and his younger brother's, when it came his turn. As you flip each page, the words are imprinted on the left side, with an illustration of the item on the right. Our oldest grandson also paged through the book as a "refresher course", so I guess this means all three have completed "Buckeyes 101", well on the way to their degrees! ;-)

The imprinted price on the book is \$10.99 - a little steep for something so small, but it's a very sturdy book that's held up well enough to be making it into the hands of our first granddaughter pretty soon!
