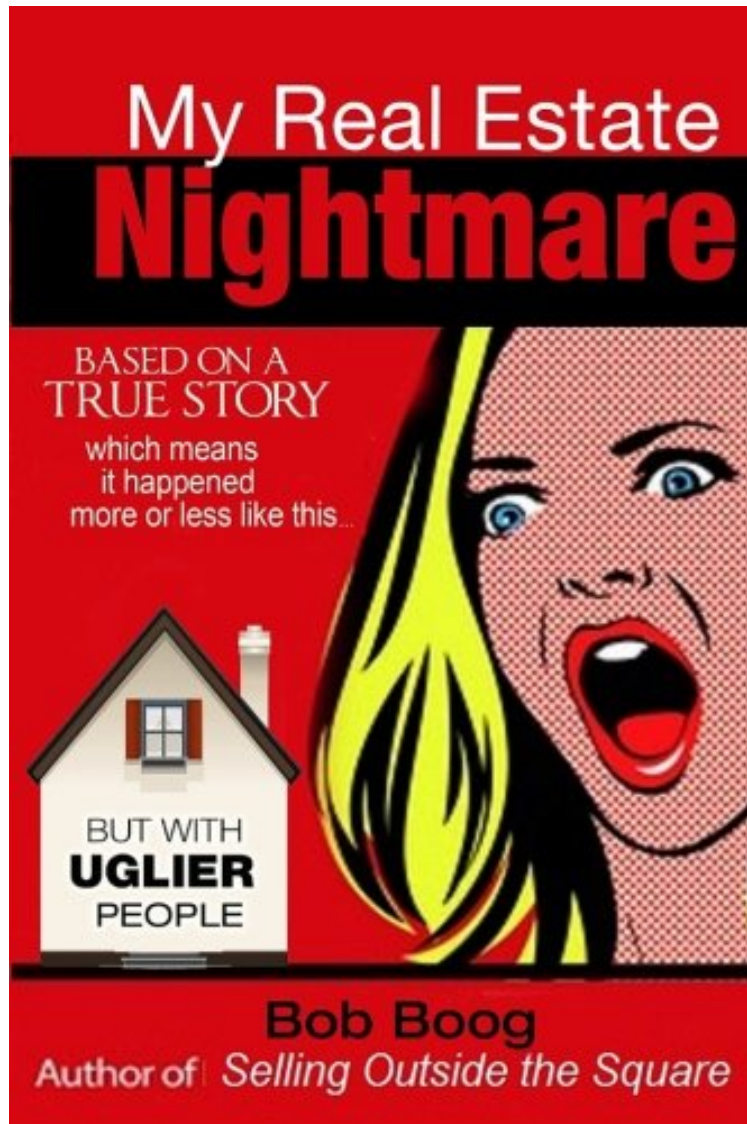

This book was a genuine comedy that could be easily turned into a movie with a foreboding violent ex-con, a Swedish model, a crazy cat lady, a Harvard-educated lawyer being brought down a few pegs and a valued piano flying out of a moving truck and being crushed by an oncoming 18-wheeler to provide the action. Best of all, it's true – or “mostly true” as the author says. It's about a real estate deal that goes haywire in unimaginable ways for the author and main character who was going out of his way to help the crazy cat lady. It's somewhat inspiring to take some of the most bizarre episodes of our own lives that could be turned into a laugh-out loud comedy. The writing style was witty and conversational from the California realtor, Bob Boog. He uses a lot of parallel descriptions to describe the characters, one resembling Brad Pitt, another Will Farrell and a Jim Carrey reference to facial expressions. It also had some nice descriptions like, “dishes were stacked up and leaning in the sink like a ‘Cat in the Hat’ book.” Throughout, I really wanted to know what happened next. The author promises an anti-climatic ending – and then over delivers with a very gratifying conclusion. A good narrative with good characters -- one suspects might be slightly exaggerated for better story telling. But a highly recommend book, and something that would be a worthwhile movie.

My Real Estate Nightmare describes the true story of real estate broker Bob Boog's attempt to help out a pony-loving California homeowner who rented half her house to a family from her church despite Bob's objections. One month later, the "good-Christian tenants" filed a restraining order against the homeowner and stopped paying her rent. And now because the homeowner cannot step within 100 yards of her own property, Bob takes it upon himself to serve the eviction paperwork to the renters. He discovers one bad thing after another: one of the tenants for example is violent and has recently been released from the state penitentiary. The homeowners pony is malnourished and the condition of the property is deplorable. Nevertheless, Bob manages to sell the property for DOUBLE what the owner paid, without the tenants finding out about it. But as the old saying goes, "No good deed ever goes unpunished" and after all his hard work at successfully evicting the tenants and closing escrow on the property, the pony-loving homeowner hires a top-notch lawyer and sues Bob. This lawyer has never lost a case and will teach Bob a lesson he will NEVER forget! But just as cartoon character Wiley E Coyote always remained loyal to the Acme brand of products, no matter how badly he was injured by them, you too may find yourself rooting for Bob at the end of this story. Note: there is language not suitable for children under the age of 13, so consider this book to be rated a solid PG13.
