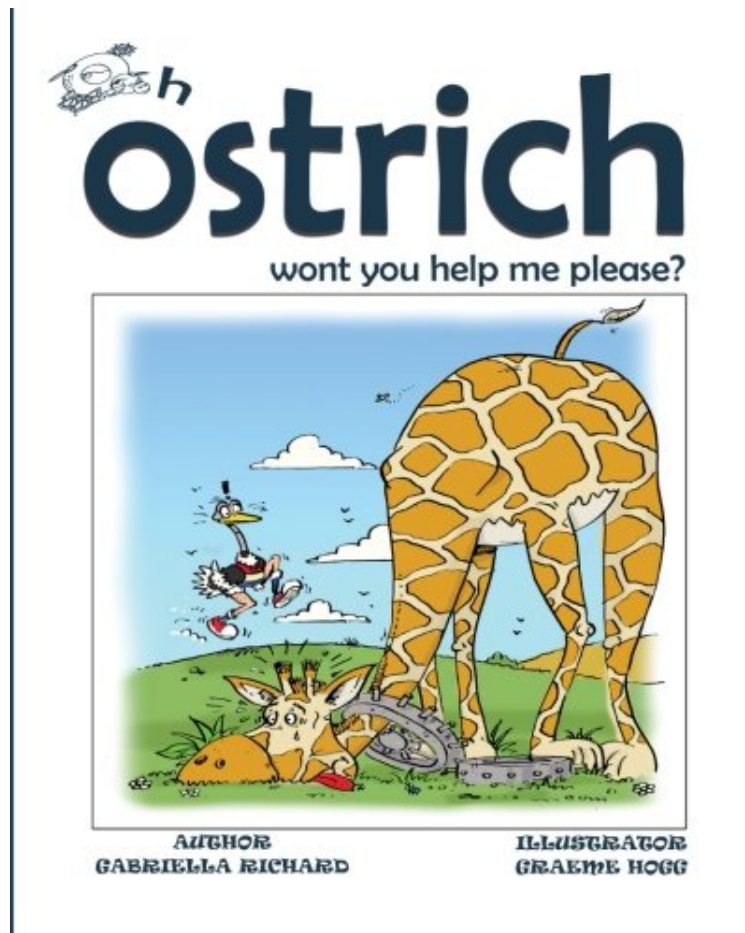

A few inconsistencies in rhythm, very small pictures, and not too much elaboration with the plot, and slightly strained with hyena's continual resurrection.
