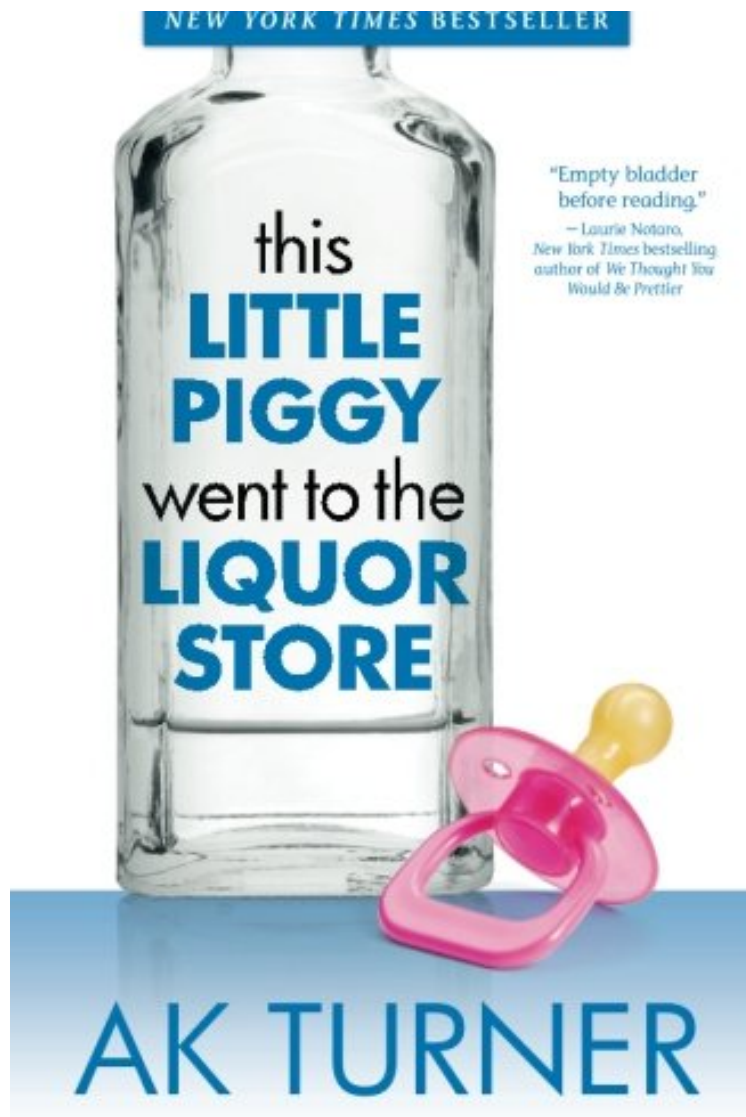

That's what it's about - raising kids - and how parents react when the kids are with them and awake, and when they're not. This is droll, almost sardonic stuff, but Turner always rescues you from going too far down those kinds of roads with lines that make you do a double take and bust out with a big guffaw. You also have to appreciate potty humor now and then because when raising young kids that's about all you can expect or get sometimes. Which reminds me, the scene in the hospital was utterly hilarious. Remember it? Or lines like these: "Luckily, my future husband agreed to skip children. If we reproduced, our kids would inherit crooked teeth, poor vision, acne, psoriasis, and uncontrollable flatulence, all contained within a body not likely to grow much beyond five feet tall. That was just the outward, physical legacy. They'd also have to contend with obsessive compulsive tendencies, a love of vice, and rampant bitchiness. I don't feel a need to identify which traits would come from which parent; suffice it to say that we felt it our duty not to pass these afflictions on to another human." - Turner, A.K. (2012-08-02).
