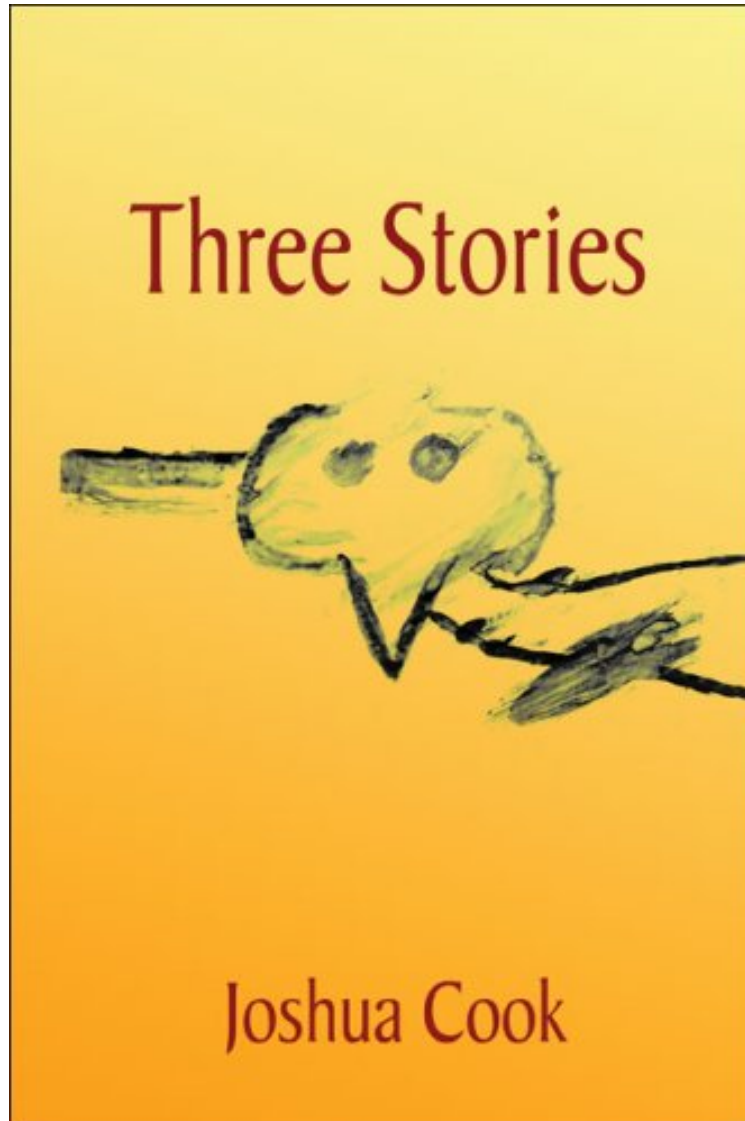

Cook's perspective on life leaves the reader reaching for tissues to wipe the tears of laughter away. For those of us who know Cook personally and have experienced some aspects of life with him, we understand the complexities that he leads us to believe are not there. This book does not rely on that connection to

Cook himself, however; for those who do not know Cook, it is simply funny. As with so many of Cook's other pieces, he has the unique perspective of the quiet person in the corner looking out and observing the world. Each of the "Three Stories" shows the reader life from the outside realm of what we normally read about politically, personally, and mentally. Although we may see, think, or hear the ideas that he discusses, we typically do not talk about them (unless it's during a private conversation with our mom that we make her swear she will never disclose to anyone!).

Three Stories includes the reflections of an increasingly jaded journalist embedded with a well-intentioned presidential candidate with no chances for success in a political system dominated by money and pretty faces; the harrowing tale of a businessman who has a serious accident just before he is to give the most important presentation of his life; and an adventure taking place in a future in which faith and progress are diametrically opposed. Any persons attempting to find any meaning in any of these pieces clearly have too much time on their hands.
