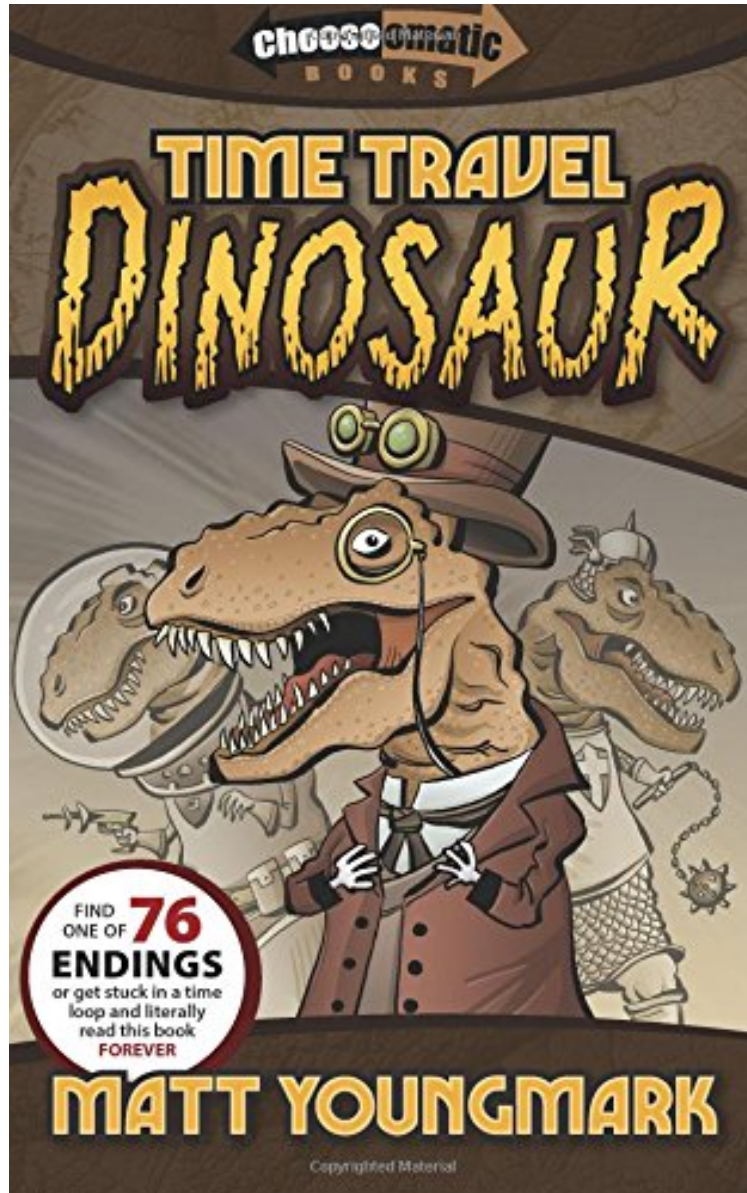

might well have bought this book based on the title alone. But I enjoyed *Zombocalypse Now*, the first of Matt Youngmark's Chooseomatic books, which are outrageous takes on the venerable Choose-Your-Own-Adventure format. I like this one even better. Writing a time-travel novel--or sometimes just reading one--is challenging enough, what with paradoxes and alternate timelines and characters flip-flopping among past, present, and future. Tackling time-travel in the inherently gnarly and repeatedly recursive Chooseomatic format . . . well, that takes guts. Big, steaming, heaps of dinosaur entrails, which you will encounter in these pages. In the role of a hapless Time Travel Investigation Agency bureaucrat, you are flung hither and yon through time, from the Cretaceous to the Middle Ages to a very steampunk 1880s to several flavors of future. You are alternately helped and hindered by the fact that you are sometimes--for perfectly plausible reasons--a dinosaur. To carry out your mission, save the world, or just save your bacon, you must deal with a host of colorful characters, including a genuine mad scientist, his perfectly sane dog, and chrononauts. (My favorites are the dolphin-headed woman and a hotdogging time cop who will induce flashbacks of *Hard Target* and, well, *Timecop*.) As you and other characters create multiple versions of yourselves and the timelines proliferate, only two things are certain: a lot of your choices won't end well for you, and the ride will be hella fun. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
