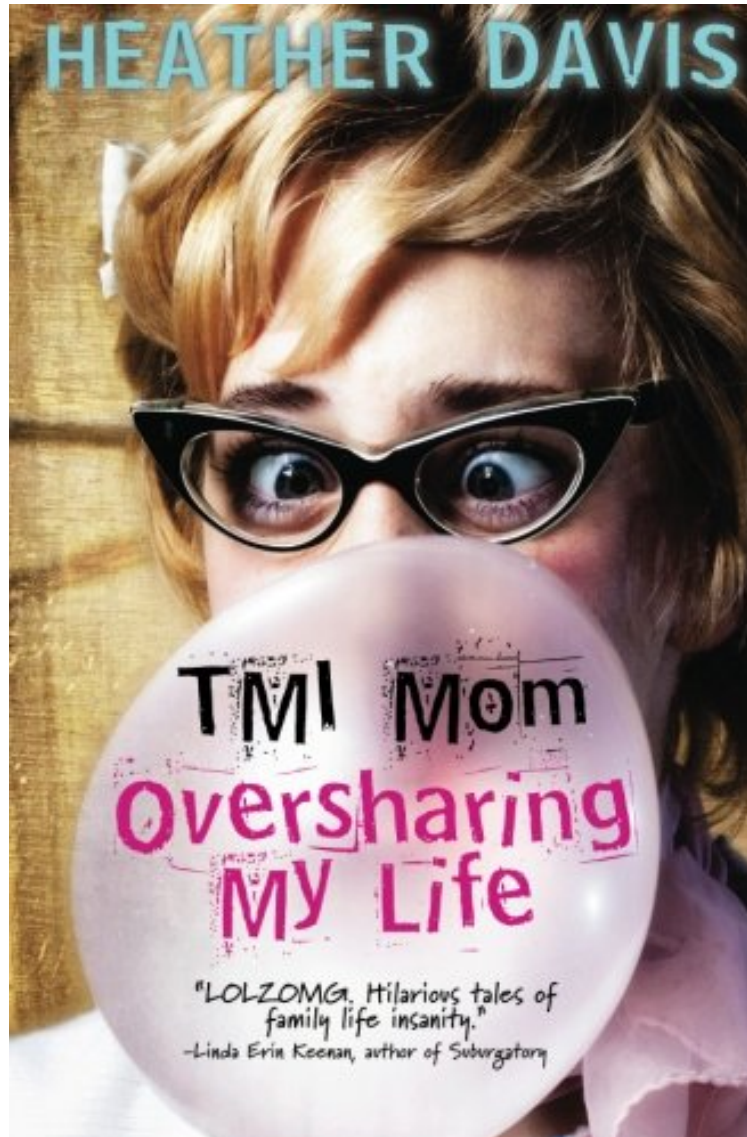

I'm not quite sure of the purpose, unless it's to give you a sign, like the old "Applause" signs on 50s sitcoms, sort of a "Laugh here" sign. All it does, in my opinion, of course, is interrupt the flow of the story and become an irritating distraction. Warning, the next statement isn't helpful, just my personal sidenote. The author states she'd rather her daughters not play soccer because it's like watching paint dry, but says cow pasture pool, otherwise known as "golf" is absolutely acceptable, even encouraged. I think it's six of one and half a dozen of the other.
