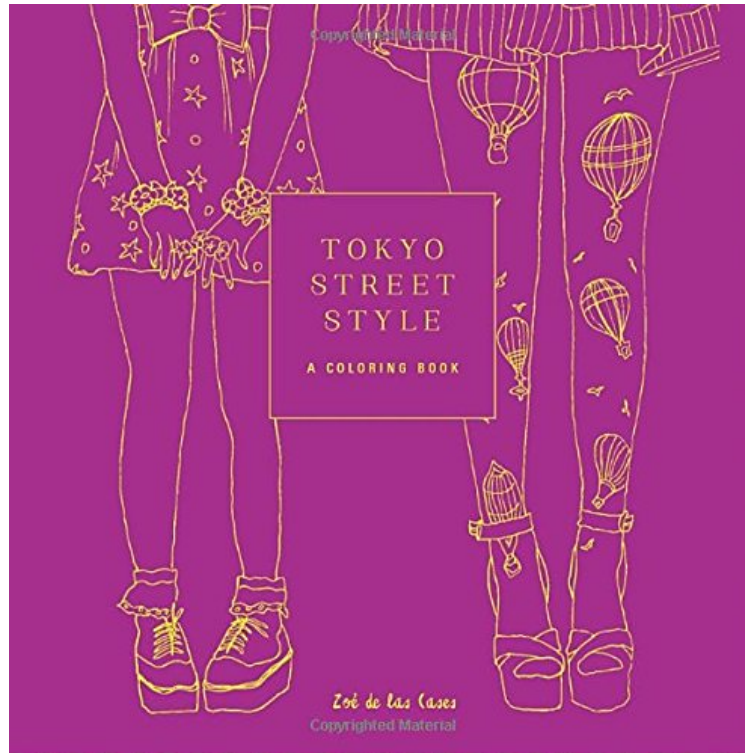

It is so nice that I had to break out my new set of Papermate Flairs with the new summer colors.It is filled with fashion, both new and Japanese traditional, plus Japanese landscapes and buildings. I colored three pages the day I received it. And when I was done coloring, there is an elastic strap that will keep my book closed. This means I can take it with me and not have to worry that the pages will get bent, twisted or torn. There are very few words in this coloring book. An uninspiring, sloppy mess.By CatWriterLibrarianThe fun thing about adult coloring books is that, when well executed, they can double as adult picture books. (In other words, one can derive enjoyment flipping through the pages colored or uncolored. See Daria Song's works for example.) Unfortunately, Tokyo Street Style does not impress in either department.Most of the pages in this book appear sloppily done, with very little attention to detail. There are several continuity issues where outlines (for pottery, lanterns, human limbs, etc.) are missing segments. As is common with other coloring books, entire pages are devoted to abstract patterns / floral arrangements; in some instances, these are so simply done as to look like scribbles. Some might argue that this is a stylistic choice on the part of the artist. Others might call it fun or charming. In my opinion, it's evidence of laziness.Six of the pages show Japanese characters

translated into English: flower, happiness, dream, friendship, hope, and “Happy New Year!” These words/phrases are a nice touch; it’s a shame the artist didn’t incorporate more of them. The book comes with a handy yellow ribbon bookmark and a built-in elastic band to keep the pages closed. There’s also a visual index of the drawings.
