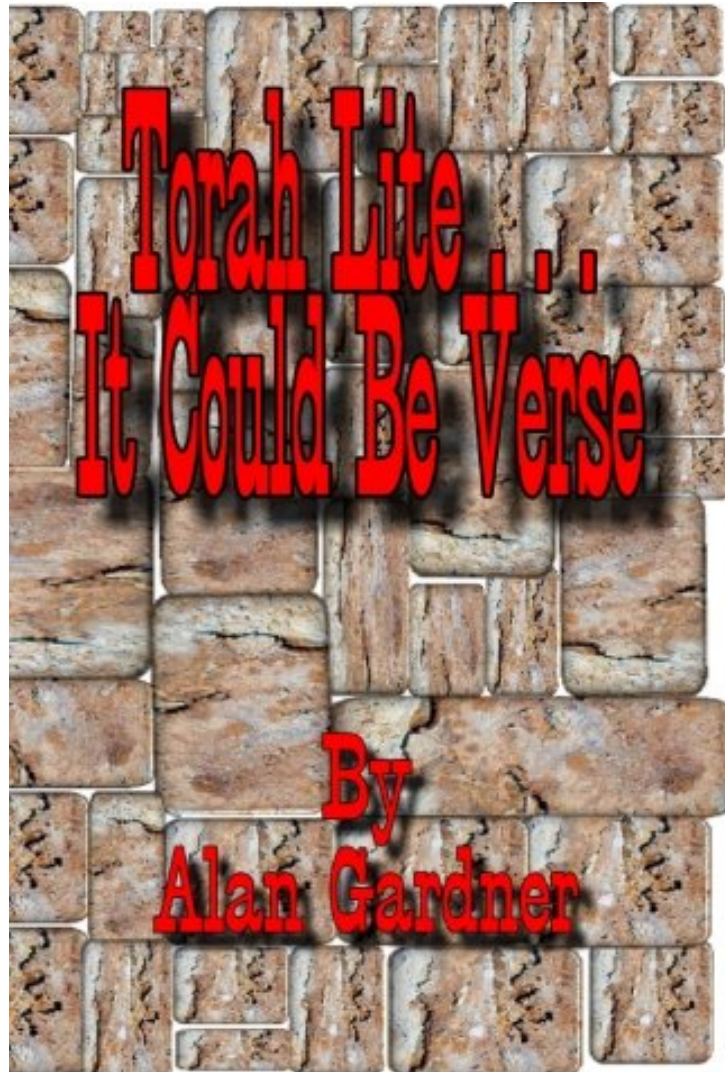

Included, also in rhyme, are biblical stories such as Jonah and the Whale, David and Goliath, and King Solomon to name a few.
